

part and The Burial Board for the Parish of South Walsham in the County of Norfolk hereinafter called The Purchaser of the fifth part **Whereas** with the concurrance of the Governors the Lands and Headments hereinbefore conveyed were on the twentieth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty two surrendered to the said Governors the Lands and Headments according to the custom of the Manor of North Walsham in the County of Norfolk to the use of George Knivitch black tanner burgess burgher of Achmanhaugh otherwise Achmanhaugh in the Diocese of Norwich and County of Norfolk for ever and to his and their assigns

And Whereas the Incumbent was on the seventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty four instituted to the Benefice of Bucton Saint Lawrence with Achmanhaugh and was on the twenty sixth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety six admitted to the said

Headments comprised in the before named Surrender as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bucton Saint Lawrence with Achmanhaugh **And**

Whereas a Sale of the Headments hereinbefore described has been deemed advantageous to the said Benefice and a Settlement has been made for such sale to the Purchaser for the sum of six hundred and six pounds and five shillings such sum having appeared to the Governors Ordinary and Patron to be fair and reasonable **And Whereas** the Incumbent at the cost of the Purchaser has enfranchised the lands and

headments hereinbefore conveyed and such Enfranchisement was effected by an Indenture dated the ~~sixteenth~~ day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety six and made between The Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England Lords of the said Manor of South Walsham of the

one part and the Incumbent of the other part **Now this Indenture witnesseth** that in pursuance of the said indenture the said

Incumbent with the consent of the Governors and of the Ordinary and Patron **Doth** hereby in virtue of the power of the Church Building Act 1839 and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf and in consideration of the sum of six hundred and six pounds and five shillings paid to the Governors by the Purchaser the payment of which sum is acknowledged by the receipt of the Treasurer of the Governors endorsed hereon conveyed unto the Purchaser and their assigns **All that** piece or part of land

headments and pasture situate at South Walsham in the County of Norfolk and containing by advertisement from about three rods and

sixteen perches as the same is delineated in the Plan drawn in the margin of these premises and thereon sealed **To hold** the said

premises unto and to the use of the Purchaser in full simple **And** the Incumbent doth hereby warrant unto the Purchaser that he

the Incumbent has not at any time heretofore done or knowingly ~~done~~ or received or been party or privy to anything whereby or by means

whereof the said premises hereinbefore expressed to be hereby conveyed or any of them in any part thereof or to it may be converted or affected

in any manner whatsoever or whereby he is in anywise prevented from conveying the same premises or any of them in manner aforesaid **In**

witness whereof the Governors have hereunto affixed their common seal for affixed the Ordinary has set his hand and caused his Episcopal Seal

to be affixed and the other parties have at their respective hands and seals the day and year first above written
