It is stated that at a special Court Baron of this Manor held on this day before the Deputy Steward came Elizabeth Watts in her own proper person and did in open Court before the whole homage thereof surrender out of her hands into the hands of the Lord of this Mannor by the hands of his said Deputy Steward by the Rod

All and every her messuages lands tenements and hereditaments whatsoever holden of this Mannor

And the reversion to

And all the Estate right title use interest, trust, equity and benefits of redemption property claim and demands with the appurtenances

To the only and absolute use and behoof of George Kenwrick Clerk and his successors curate of Ashmunhall otherwise Ashmenhaw in the dioceses of Norwich and County of Norfolk for ever and to his and their assigns.

Which said George Kenwrick being present in Court in his own proper person humbly prayed the favour of the Lord of this Mannor and of this Court to be admitted tenant to the premises so surrendered to him as aforesaid that is to say

To four several inclosures lying together in North Walsham between the Kings highway called Marshgate Lane on the West and the common pasture of North Walsham to the East and abutts on the lands of John Withers in part of Francis Bullen in part and the lands formally of Guwen Hudson and now of John Gann in part to the South and the lands of Thomas Cooper esq to the North containing together 16 acres be the same more or less except 2 roods thereof theretofore sold to John Gann And also 2 acres of marsh and several lying in Marshgate with their and every of their appurtenances

To hold to him the said George Kenwrick and his assigns successors so long as he and they shall continue and be curates of the said Parish of Ashmunhall otherwise Ashmenhaw of the Lord of this Mannor at the will of the Lord according to the custom of this Mannor by the rents and services therefore due and of right accustomed saving everyones right and so forth and he gave to the Lord for a fine and so forth and he is thus admitted tenant and his fealty is respited
